
Luck of the Community UUCG Auction on March 18 at 6:00pm

Growing a Beloved Community Barbara Stahnke, President

This year the board is in preparation for strategic planning. We are reading a short book *Growing a Beloved Community* because it inspires, informs and connects us to our vision. We are asking ourselves key questions that we developed at the Board Retreat in August that can help us understand the best ways to govern for our vision to be achieved. This month's question was delayed due to the injury I suffered with my foot. I am healing, and we will get back on track with the board conversation in February.

What I did learn this month is that there is help available when needed from UUCGers; and if physical help is not needed, there is caring listening – caring expressions of concern – and caring forgiveness. I connected to this first month of Jan's absence from our community like last years, except – we can't say – "let's wait until Jan gets back" – unless the decision can wait until the end of summer. I remembered that we have some awesome lay leaders to lead us in "Singing the Journey" this year. I learned that we have awesome leaders of ministry, governance and social justice (shout out to those that attended marches, and those who are working at communicating across divisive lines) to learn what we need to be doing differently or the same next year when Rev. Jan returns. I am getting to know our staff from a different perspective – especially our newest staff member Michael Parker who I am loving for his dedication to living out our principles to grow with us, and living our music in a new way. I got to hear worship from our contracted ministers who were AWESOME; this "awesome" in my heart made me wonder, "how often do I listen to a worship from Rev. Jan or our lay leaders with the level of intensity and commitment I brought to those worships?".

So as usual, I grew – I grew in personal love and commitment to UUCG; I grew in personal commitment to the worship service – expecting always the best and always learning something; I grew in personal love and gratitude for the people in this congregation. I grew in LOVE; isn't that what it is all about. Let us take the words from our Guest Ministers to heart (my understanding of their message) –

Let us commit to a sacrificial love that dares to call us to higher selves. (Rev. Arsenault)

And from our Board of Trustees: Let us grow this beloved community together!
