Our Whole Lives Program for Teens and Tweens



It is our tradition here at UUCG to offer specialized youth programs annually, on alternating years. This coming spring (2018), Faith Development will be offering O.W.L. for 7th - 9th grade students.

O.W.L. stands for Our Whole Lives. Developed by the UUA and the United Church of Christ, OWL is a sexuality education curriculum available for ages 5 through adult. At UUCG, we present the program for adolescents. OWL is more than just a lesson in the nuts and bolts of sex. It is a program designed to model and teach caring, compassion, respect, and justice. OWL addresses the values and feelings that youth have about themselves and the world. And your community of faith is a great place to start this conversation.

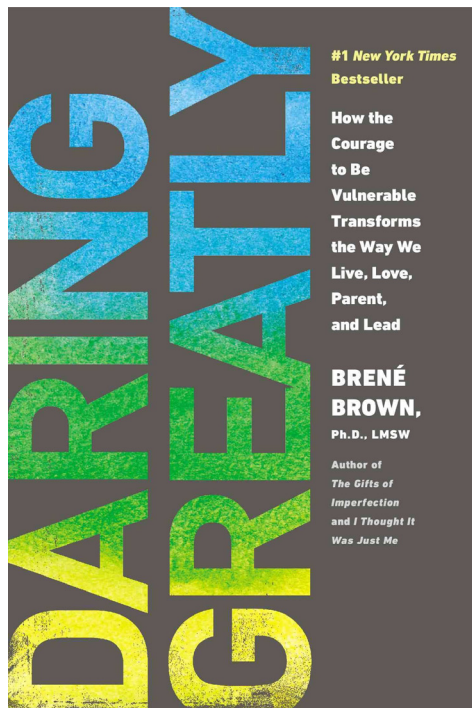

A Message from Barbara Stahnke



UUCG welcomes families of all types and sizes at UUCG. As part of this welcoming practice, we gladly offer childcare at all UUCG events so that all adults may fully participate in the life of the congregation.

As part of creating a safe community, children and teens are supervised at all times at UUCG. In our classes, programs, and childcare, UUCG policy specifies that a minimum of two adults, from different households and with a current background check on file, provide supervision. For those in our nursery or toddler room, one adult is from our professional childcare staff and the other is an approved volunteer.

If you are a committee chair or group planner and would like childcare at your event, please provide a month's notice of your event so we can advertise accordingly, make arrangements with our professional staff, and solicit childcare reservations. Please also identify the volunteer providing childcare so that we can verify the background check is on file or make those arrangements. Or, notify Christiana McQuain at cmcquain@uucg.org if you need assistance in locating a volunteer childcare provider.

If you are a parent and seeking childcare at an event other than Sunday morning, please visit www.uucg.org and select "Register for Event". We ask at least a week's notice to make arrangements for childcare. Childcare is available without a reservation for Sunday morning, including 10:00am Faith Development programs, 11:00am Worship services, and 12:30pm Congregational Meetings.

If you enjoy working with children and would like to be added to our list of childcare volunteers, please contact Christiana McQuain or Laura de Castro (Ldecastro@uucg.org). Laura completes all UUCG background checks and both administrative staff members can answer questions and access the list of approved volunteers. This is an excellent opportunity to meet the children of fellow congregants and their families.

Children and teens are welcome to attend events with parents too.

Growing a Beloved Community Barbara Stahnke, President

This year the board is in preparation for strategic planning. We are reading a short book *Growing a Beloved Community* because it inspires, informs and connects us to our vision. We are asking ourselves key questions that we developed at the Board Retreat in August that can help us understand the best ways to govern for our vision to be achieved. This month's question: "How do we communicate with our congregation and our committees in doing our work toward our vision?" The Chapter we read was Spread our Good News.

As I reflect this month on the question, I am recalling all the good news in our Annual Report. When I think about all the activities we did just this year, I am impressed and overjoyed. Remember this good news and the fact that UUCG has been doing this kind of work for 35 going on 36 years. Now how do we take this kind of activity to grow our faith into that beloved community that we envision with our radical welcome and connections within our walls and beyond?

To become radically welcoming and connecting within our community and beyond, we must deal with the white supremacy in our systems. Our good news is that we have a tool to stay with the work – our covenant. I know that I try to live that covenant every day of my life, and I am emboldened to do so by seeing at work in our community. Our good news is that we have faith leaders and elders in our home church that are willing to learn, try, stumble and then try again in our safe and healing space. The healing we do for and with each other, the forgiveness we grant ourselves and each other, the knowledge we gain from others and share from within ourselves, all of this we take out of UUCG into the wider world. That is our good news. We are going to live this stuff day in and day out because we are called to create the world we want to live in. Let us strengthen ourselves with our good news so that we can look at our systems, at our policies, at our procedures, at our ministries to dismantle white supremacy once and for all.

Summary of the month from the board: How do we communicate with our congregation and our committees in doing our work toward our vision? We are a safe and healing space. The way we are with each other – being in covenant. Just being a Unitarian Universalist with our neighbors without defining it for them – living out our values. Every meeting we should be talking about the good news of what we are doing.

We don't have to be perfect to evangelize for our faith. We just need to live our UU values with our family, friends, coworkers and communities – and stay in the battle for all of our lives. Let us grow this beloved community together.



General Assembly

June 21-25 in New Orleans



UUA GENERAL ASSEMBLY

General Assembly (GA) is the annual meeting of our Unitarian Universalist Association (UUA). Attendees worship, witness, learn, connect, and make policy for the Association through democratic process.
