



As you may now know, one of my favorite quotes about money is from Dan Hotchkiss, "there is no goal so purely spiritual that it requires no money and no action so financial as to lack ethical or spiritual implications." We are all making choices daily on where we put our money that impacts our world. I personally have committed a major part of my giving to UUCG; I also give to the Georgia Sea Turtle Center, Black Lives of UU, political campaigns, and Black women in need as assigned by my Black women accountability partners. I try to spend my money appropriately in purchasing groceries, clothing and major expenditures. I am working on learning about my personal finances as well as major economic decision making to better inform my money decision making.

So, money decision making is important spiritual work for me. Keeping current with my pledge to UUCG so that UUCG is there to feed me in my spiritual development and activities helps me grow spiritually. Feeding my community of love that calls me to live out my values in the larger world feeds my acknowledgement of the need to budget for UUCG in my expenditures. Knowing that UUCG needs my money to be there for now and for the next generation of folks in Gwinnett that need a liberal spiritual home.

The timing of the income is important as well. Our budget was balanced on a refinance that included operational dollars. That refinance is going slower than anticipated. We have successfully maintained our ability to pay staff and bills through the generous prepayment of pledge dollars by several members and friends. However, we are going into the summer months where UUCG income drops off as members and friends take summer vacations and are absent from church as well. We additionally have some members and friends who are behind in their planned giving.

Three things come to mind:

- If you are having challenges in your life, we are a community of support and love - FIRST, please talk to Rev. Jan or a Board member to let us know so we can provide that support and love.
- If you have just forgotten to pay toward your pledge, I hope you will take this call to bring your pledge current.
- If you are able to pay toward your pledge in advance of summer vacation, we would be grateful for that consideration.
- If there are other considerations about your relationship with UUCG, please reach out to Rev. Jan or to a member of the Board of Trustees.

The New Moon Women's Circle, June 15, 6:30 pm




