

Why Invite a Friend?

Did you come to a UU congregation because someone invited you? If not, did you wish someone had?

Did you know that 70-90% of people who join a congregation already have a friend or relative in the congregation or visit for the first time because someone invited them? Yet the average Unitarian Universalist only invites a person to church once every 26 years! What's up with that?

Maybe it's because we don't have the "salvation" imperative in our theology ... or do we? Not that "heaven or hell" imperative, but the lifesaving message of Love beyond belief ... that whatever your understanding of the holy, the divine, God, or Goddess, you are welcome in THIS faith community. How has Unitarian Universalism made a difference in your life? Or that of someone you know? Or the lives of countless unknown people through our commitment to justice in the world?

Is there someone in your life that you want to introduce to your community at UUCG? A neighbor, co-worker, relative, parents of your children's friends, or someone you volunteer with in a local organization?

The Big Pitch...

A true and authentic invitation comes from the heart and in one's own words. We have some suggestions, but only you can share what UUCG means to you and why you want to share this community with your friend. Here's a suggestion to get you started:

"On Sunday, September 9 and again on September 16 my congregation is having "Friendship Sunday" and I'd love for you to be there. The worship service will feature a message from our minister, music from our choir, and we'll have food following the service. As you know, this community is very important to me, a place where I feel fully welcome to be myself ... it feels like home. As someone who is very important to me in my life, I want you to see this place and meet some of the people who also mean so much to me. Would you be willing to join me for one of these services? It's just one Sunday; there's no expectation to join ... just come meet some of my friends and see what I love about this community." (WAIT FOR RESPONSE) "Yes! Great! Which Sunday would work best for you?" (WAIT FOR RESPONSE) "Okay, I'll be sure to get there early that day and keep an eye out for you. Here's a card with the address, the time of the service, and our website in case you want to get more information before you come. Also, we have many events coming up that we could do together... [SHARE INFORMATION ABOUT DATE & EVENT(S) YOU ARE GOING TO DURING FRIENDSHIP FORTNIGHT].

Offer them the card with the information about when and where. Indicate the activities on the back that you have invited them to go to with you. This is a way to introduce them to something you enjoy doing at UUCG that you think they might enjoy as well.

Why is this invitation special?

You are only asking the person to experience something that is important to you, not to convert to Unitarian Universalism.

You are honoring the person by inviting them to meet others who are also important in your life.

You are being very clear and honest about the agenda and content of the day.

You are making a straight forward invitation without bargaining, pleading or coercing. The other has the right and opportunity to say "no" without consequences or diminishing the relationship.

If they ask	You could say
What happens during the service?	We hear music and sing songs. There are opening and closing words, a story, and a message from our minister. The whole service is about 75 minutes.
Do I have to sing?	You get to sing if you want to; and, you don't have to if you don't want to.
Will there be a time of prayer?	We often have moments of silence, reflection, meditation, or prayer. These are quiet times when one can be alone with their thoughts and feelings.
Will I be asked to introduce my- self?	You will not be singled out to speak. You will be asked to wear a name tag if you choose. People will welcome you, introduce themselves, and engage with you.
Will I have to sign anything?	If you like what you find at UUCG you will have the opportunity to share your contact information with us so we can follow-up with you, and you can choose to sign the guest book when you arrive, or not.
Can my children come and what will they experience?	INFANTS/TODDLERS/PRE-K: We have child care for infants through pre-K during the service, and children are welcome to attend worship with family.
(If you are a younger person extending an invitation to your friends from school, sports, scouts, drama, music, or other activities, adapt these answers to make sure your friend feels welcome!)	EARLY ELEMENTARY (5-7): Children join their families for the first part of the service, then they may choose to leave with others their age and our trained adult volunteers for an age-appropriate program that runs until after the service. They can also choose to stay with their families for the whole service.
	HIGH SCHOOL (9-17): Our services are for all ages. We encourage families to be together during the service, or for teens to sit with their friends. On September 16, the teens in our congregation will have a gathering after the service and your teens are welcome to join them.
Is there Sunday School?	At 10:00 a.m., before the worship service, we have two programs:
	Adults/Teens: We have programs related to our monthly theme (Vocation) suitable for adults and teens. No registration necessary just show up!
	Upper Elementary (Tweens): This program includes activities that encourage curiosity and exploration into our annual them "Let Your Life Speak."
	Child Care is available for younger siblings during our 10:00 programs.
So why is this UU thing so important to you? Why is this congregation so important to you?	Insert your own answer and be prepared to respond! If you stutter or stammer or have to think about it too long, your friend will being to wonder if this place is worth visiting. Suggestions:
	It's important to me because this faith honors the many paths to truth and meaning available through a responsible relationship with all the wisdom traditions, as well as through my experiences, the words and deeds of prophetic people, and my own conscience.
	It's important to me because we have a strong commitment to environmental justice and ecological living we know that climate change is real and we need to be responsible in our relationship with the earth.
	It's important to me because we have a commitment to being radically welcoming which means we affirm and promote the inherent worth and dignity of all people which compels us to learn about racism and systems of white supremacy, sexism and how to be more welcoming to people who are gay, lesbian, bisexual, transgender, queer, and gender-non-conforming, and to other people who are traditionally marginalized and oppressed.

Creating a Visible and Welcoming Sanctuary



Thirty-eight people, count 'em - 38 people!! generously donated many hours of time, energy, and a good bit of sweat equity over the course of three Saturdays to make our UUCG property more visible and welcoming. Under the guidance of Pieter van der Meer, and his co-workers Tanya and Thea, of Ahimsa Gardens in Atlanta, we cleared out miles of invasive, thorny vines that were choking several of our most beautiful trees and bushes. Special thanks to our Property Beautification Team: Betsy Connell, Carol Kreson, and Joy Rooney, for planning and organizing these efforts. It's wonderful to be able

to see our building from the road and to have more spaces where we can experience the beauty of our property.

The next step in this beautification plan is to create a pollinator garden in the front grove dedicated to the memory of Nancy Jacobsen for all the work she did in planning, creating, and maintaining our original landscaping for many years. Nancy died in 2015, and we received a gift from her estate to create space on our property to honor her contributions and keep her memory alive. There will, of course, be on-going work to continue sprucing up our property. Watch for announcements of future work days when the weather is a wee bit cooler!
