

Corley Teacher Appreciation Event





Gadding About. . . By Reverend Jan Taddeo

It's been a while since I've written a Gadding About column, and, I've been doing a lot of gadding about lately, so it seems like a good time to revive my column.

I continue in my training as a Warrior for the Human Spirit under the leadership of Meg Wheatley and Jerry Granelli. The primary sources for the teachings in this program are *Shambhala: The Sacred Path of the Warrior* by Chögyam Trungpa, and *Who Do We Choose to Be* by Margaret Wheatley. We also draw from many other sources ... the list gets longer each month. Now in my third year of this training, I was accepted into the role of "Senior Student," meaning that I am one of 20 other students taking a leadership role in guiding other students in conversations about the teachings we explore each month.

This program has provided opportunities for me to visit some very sacred places in Colorado, New Mexico, and Utah in which our connections with the earth have been a profound aspect of the training. I am grateful for the opportunity to receive and take part in this training. It is deepening my compassion and broadening my insight and discernment in these troubled times across the globe. It becomes clearer with each month that passes that a prime directive for these times is to build strong community connections right where we are ... starting within our walls, and moving beyond them as effectively as we can.

In that effort, my gadding about has included participation in the Gwinnett Interfaith Alliance and the Gwinnett County Community Remembrance Project. It is inspiring, and joyful, to meet so many other leaders in our wider community who are committed to teaching tolerance, building interfaith relations, and exploring healing and reconciliation for our past as we engage in the remembrance of African Americans who were lynched in Gwinnett County.

I've been gadding about in Unitarian Universalist circles as well. Christiana McQuain and I are participating in a program offered by the Transforming Hearts Collective called Trans Inclusion in Congregations. We are participating within our respective professional organizations -- Christiana with other professional religious educators, and I with other ministers, and then we share notes. I thought I knew most of what I needed to know about gender identity and trans inclusion, but every month I find there is still so much to learn.

Our theme for March is Wisdom. In a philosophy class I took a very long time ago, I recall a Socratic expression that went something like this: "They who believe they are wise, are not at all wise; and those who claim no wisdom, are wise." This is more about humility than about knowledge or wisdom. What is wisdom to one person, may not be wise at all for someone else, so we are wise to move through our learnings and our knowings with a sense of humility, prepared to learn more, and know differently.

This is the value in gadding about. Meeting new people, hearing new ideas, learning new ways to understand and interact with the people I encounter each day help me to see what I don't know. We are all perfectly imperfect works in progress, which opens up infinite ways to be more compassionate, more kind, and more curious every day.
