





Beloveds, I am eager to return to our shared ministry - I've missed you all so much. I have used this time well to rest, learn, contemplate, meditate, and develop a healthier routine for my continued service to UUCG and the wider community. I recently returned from a retreat at The Mountain Retreat Center, and I am looking forward to most of us being there together September 16-18!

Our theme for March is "Renewing Faith" and I look forward to our shared explorations on this theme. Faith is often a challenging concept for Unitarian Universalists, especially those who had difficult experiences with previous religious organizations that may have offered a very limiting or rigid perspective on faith.

For me, faith is about where I place my heart and seeking insights about what I can trust in this world, especially in turbulent times such as these. On top of our own personal challenges and losses, war is imminent in Ukraine (and possibly beyond), the pandemic is becoming endemic, democracy is declining around the world (including in the United States), there is a strong possibility that Roe v. Wade will be struck down leaving people who need to terminate a pregnancy in a very difficult situation, and the Arctic ice is melting much faster than anticipated. There are hard times now and ahead for life on our planet.

How will we be over the next few years as this escalates? How will we live fully into our Unitarian Universalist faith that is grounded in love, curiosity, courage, compassion, justice, and the inherent goodness of life? How will we respond to what is needed within our congregation and beyond? We won't fully answer these questions in a month, but we can build on our vision about the work that is ours to do in our wider community. In difficult times, it is our faith in all that we value that can keep us committed to compassionate acts, strong in our resolve to serve the needs in the community, and open to extending our hearts and hands in new ways.

I also want to lift up the importance of faith to move us closer to one another, and to guide us in seeing all that is good in this world ... the family and friends whom we treasure, the joy we find in music, art, the natural world, and in the gift of life we share with all beings on this planet. During difficult times, we are well served to notice the beauty, joy, and goodness that is all around us. We can commit to living more fully each day and treasuring the moments that remind us that life is good. In that spirit, I offer a quote from Thich Nhat Hanh that I read first thing each morning to guide me through the day:

Waking up this morning, I smile. Twentyfour brand new hours are before me. I want to live fully in each moment and to look at all beings with the eyes of compassion.

General Assembly (GA) is the annual meeting of our Unitarian Universalist Association (UUA). Participants worship, witness, learn, connect, and make policy for the Association through democratic process. UUCG sends delegates to General Assembly each year to represent the congregation by attending business meetings and casting votes on the issues presented annually. This year, much of the conversation will concern the Article II Study Commission's task of reviewing and proposing revisions to the Principles and Purposes of the UUA. We, as a congregation, have already begun discussion of these topics to listen and learn from each other, and to eventually inform our votes (via our delegates) on these issues when they come up in 2024.

We invite you to consider applying to be a delegate to represent UUCG at this year's General Assembly. Keep an eye out for more information on the privileges and responsibilities of being a delegate in upcoming newsletters. If you have questions, please reach out to Rev. Jan, any member of the Board, the Lay Ministers, or Staff. We are happy to answer them for you!

From the Board

This week a team held its first meeting to devise a new Part-time Ministerial Contract that will go active in July. This move to part-time ministry is at the request of Reverend Jan. She will remain in her full-time position until June 30 and move to half time with the new program year. The team writing the contract has representation from the Board of Trustees, the Shared Ministry Council, Staff, and of course, Rev. Jan.

As we work through these changes as a congregation, one thing is abundantly clear. We need you – yes, YOU – to make the magic of UUCG hold together. Over the COVID years and throughout Rev. Jan's sabbatical, several people have given above and beyond the scope of traditional volunteerism. Those people are tired, but their jobs aren't going away. In addition, as Jan delegates some of the duties she's performed in the past, those tasks will need to be taken up by others.

In particular, we need people to serve on the Pastoral Care Committee, as new Lay Ministers (current Lay Minsters are finishing their two-year rotation soon), on the Board of Trustees, as leaders for Religious Education, and on the Sunday morning Tech Team. Rev. Jan will be in the pulpit less frequently, beginning in July. We could use your contributions to the Worship Committee. Does that seem daunting? Then sign up to assist. We're about to meet in person again and will require greeters and ushers each week.

Erika Shell-Castro has agreed to head up this year's fund-raising auction, and she's looking to pull together an auction planning team. As Coordinator of Family Ministries, Christiana McQuain has taken on a more active technological role, she needs assistance with planning Faith Development programming. This is a great job to do from home. Property workdays are held every first Saturday of the month. Spring is the perfect time to see the fruits of your labors blossom. Food Drive collection takes place every first Sunday. We're always looking for volunteers.

It's Easy Being Green

Karen Smith, a UUCG member and a suburban homesteader, got our "It's Easy Being Green" series off to a great start on Jan. 22 at the Five Forks Library. UUCG is doing this series of workshops in partnership with the Five Forks branch of the Gwinnett County Public Library. Participants at her "Living a Green Lifestyle" session were provided with many recipes for non-toxic cleaning products. They were also given a sample of a homemade laundry detergent that is economical to make, as well as non-toxic. Everyone also had an opportunity to make and take a non-abrasive soft scrub cleaner. Lorena Griffin, another UUCG member, provided every participant with the necessary materials to make a wool dryer ball to soften their clothes, which could replace the less environmentally friendly dryer sheets. Karen shared the old saying, "Use it up, wear it out, make it do, or do without", which is a good reminder of how we could all live greener in today's world.

There are three more upcoming workshops being planned for the "It's Easy Being Green" series. On April 23 at 1:00, Terry Welsher, a UUCG member and co-coordinator for the Georgia Citizen's Climate Lobby, will be doing a session called "Affecting Climate Change" at the Five Forks Public Library. He will be using a computer-model simulation that can show how small changes can make big impacts on climate change.

On March 5 from 2:00 -3:00 p.m., Jim Harper, a Gwinnett County horticulturist, will be doing a workshop called "The Climate Friendly Garden" at the Five Forks Public Library. He will present gardening and lawn care tips that promote climate resilience.

On May 6 and 7, the last session of the "It's Easy Being Green" will take place at UUCG with a "Recycling Rally". People will be invited to drop off at UUCG several items that are clean and in good working order that they no longer want on Friday, May 6 from 4:00 – 6:00 p.m. They can return to UUCG the next day, May 7 from 11:00 a.m. – 2:00 p.m. and select some items that they would like to take home with them. We are also hoping to offer minor clothing repairs on May 7th. Stay tuned for more details about this event!



Beethoven, A Life by Jan Caeyers

March 23 at 7:00PM

This new biography of Ludwig van Beethoven offers connoisseurs and newcomers alike an unparalleled story of the composer's life and works, written by a renowned conductor and scholar of Beethoven's music.

With unprecedented access to the archives at the Beethoven House in Bonn, Jan Caeyers expertly weaves together a deeply human and complex picture of Beethoven—his troubled youth, his unpredictable mood swings, his desires, relationships, and conflicts with family and friends, the mysteries surrounding his affair with the "immortal beloved," and the dramatic tale of his deafness.



Caeyers also offers new insights into Beethoven's music, showing how it transformed from the work of a skilled craftsman to that of a consummate artist. Demonstrating an impressive command of the vast scholarship on this iconic composer, Caeyers brings Beethoven's world alive with elegant prose, memorable musical descriptions, and a vivid depiction of Bonn and Vienna, where Beethoven produced and performed his works. Caeyers explores how Beethoven's career was impacted by the historical and philosophical shifts taking place in the music world and how, in turn, his trajectory changed the music industry.

Equal parts an absorbing cultural history and a lively biography, Beethoven, A Life reveals a complex portrait of the musical genius that defined a style of music and went on to become one of the great pillars of Western art music.
