Gender Neutral Restrooms

A few weeks ago, UUCG had a leak in the men's restroom. In order to get to the pipes, we had to remove the urinal and cut through the drywall. The leak was repaired quickly, but before repairing the wall and replacing the urinal, it occurred to the board that this may be a good time to consider making the change to gender neutral restrooms. The transition to gender neutral restrooms has received broad support in previous congregational visioning and planning gatherings.

Currently, people of any gender are invited to use whichever restroom they choose, but most still choose a binary option. If we are to go truly gender neutral, it would mean a change, and so we are asking for opinions and concerns, plus making ourselves available to answer questions before we make a decision about how to move forward.



The question is not only about *whether* to make both restrooms gender neutral, but also about *how* to make both restrooms gender neutral. Questions the board is discussing ... do we reinstall the urinal at all? (urinals are ecofriendly, and there are some models that are even more so) If so, do we enclose it in a stall? Do stalls need to be extended to the floor?

Gender neutral restrooms are becoming common in new construction in Europe. Many universities are also making the shift. As you consider this issue, think deeply about why you feel the way you do. Board members are available for your questions, both after the service and via email: board@uucg.org.

Sewer Project Update:

Since our last update in the GNUUS, the congregation has held a Town Hall meeting and a Congregational Meeting. The vote was overwhelmingly in favor of increasing our funding for the project from \$50,000 to \$65,000, with one abstention. We have a contractor ready to go, and we have a team of dedicated volunteers who are starting their work to raise the funds we need

to pay the contractor. What we don't have is the signed temporary construction easement from the company that owns Park 156 Apartments. We've been working since May 2nd to receive this, and we keep encountering various questions, requests, and delays from the corporate office. Our Engineer has all the paperwork and checks ready to take to the county once that easement is in hand. The county can take up to two weeks to process the paperwork necessary to issue the construction permit. When we have the permit in hand, and the contractor is ready to begin, then construction and inspection can take one to three weeks. We, the leadership team working on this process, are still confident that this can be done by the end of September; and, we are at the mercy of the landowners next door to make that possible.



Funding the Sewer Project:

In the meantime, we need to raise the money to pay the contractor! We have just over \$11,000 in our Sewer Project Fund thanks to the \$25,000 loan from our Endowment Fund (don't forget to write your Birthday Check to the fund this year!), and \$3,750 in contributions received from members. We've paid our engineer for services through August 23, and we have cut all the checks for the County permits and fees. We will need to raise at least \$25,000 by the end of September to make sure we have funds to pay for services rendered. Although we have some cash available in our Contingency Fund, those funds are in reserves to cover possible revenue shortfalls for our operating funds. If we borrow from that fund in September it will need to be replaced by the end of October. Look for more information coming soon from our Fundraising Team and please consider how you might offer a generous gift to support this foundational project. Keep in mind that once we are fully connected to the sewer system, there are so many more possibilities for the future of our facilities ... imagine a fellowship hall, more permanent storage, a couple more rooms for activities, or a goat farm! (Just kidding on that last one ... or am I?)

Turning Sun School and Sharing Space

Some have been curious about how Turning Sun is doing as we await the completion of this project. They are currently operating under a provisional license that limits their hours and their enrollment. There are eight children currently registered, and they have many on the waiting list awaiting their expanded hours, and greater age range capacity. There are now three staff persons at Turning Sun, in addition to Heather Adams, we welcome Kim, Shelby and Sylvan (also a UUCG staff person) to our community. Please offer them all a very warm welcome whenever you see them! They are fabulous people and they love UUs!! Keep an eye out for parents of the students as well ... we want them to experience the radical welcome of UUCG as well.

As we discussed long ago at our own Hall meeting in January, there have been many changes to our facilities, inside and out. Some changes are subtle and easy to take in ... like new flooring and fresh paint. Some are a little harder to adjust to, like major changes to the tot lot playground, and fencing all around. Even though we knew this was coming, we didn't know exactly what it would look like when it was implemented. The children seem to love the new play area - yay! We are working on ideas to move some of the items that were removed from the tot lot over to the larger playground and will get some new playground quality mulch for volunteers to spread there at our next

Property Work Day September 14 from 9am-2pm.

Sharing space has also presented some new considerations for how we use our space. I am so grateful for the many volunteers who have stepped forward to move chairs back and forth each week, (sign up at http://bit.ly/movechairs) and for those who assist our staff with transitioning the Garden and Castle rooms each week. We are all being more mindful of leaving our spaces ready for the next group that will use the rooms. Before long we'll feel the rhythm of a new normal.

Visioning and Fundraising for Our Dreams

Vision: We have a vision for becoming a welcoming congregation in a green space fostering connections within our walls and beyond.

Purpose: To raise funds to transform and expand our space and further our work as a liberal faith community

We have a designated reserve account where all funds raised for the "Visioning and Fundraising for Our Dreams" will be placed. The long term need is to establish a strong capital fund for our dreams of improved facilities to last into the future. However, our immediate need is for \$25,000 to help cover the cost for the structural foundation work on our church property, (i.e. the sewer) by the end of September. This sewer work is a necessity for us to move forward in transforming and expanding our space. We already have an opening anonymous contribution of \$2,000. We need you to determine what additional funds, beyond your regular yearly pledge, that you can contribute by the end of September to help us raise this \$25.000.

Boy Scout Troop Update: A Sad Sayonara

Three years ago, UUCG chartered the first Boy Scouts of America troop affiliated with a UU congregation in the US in more than 20 years. Sadly, that chapter of our history is closing. There are several reasons.

The troop leadership profile doesn't match the need. Most troops are run by parents – both the scoutmasters running the meetings and activities as well as the committee members running the

administrative side. Despite repeated pleas, current parents have not stepped up. We have had help, but it has been insufficient. We are exhausted and simply don't have the time.

We have been unable to sustain membership. Each October we get a crop of new boys and by January the attrition rate is greater than 50 percent. Boys today, at least in our area, are less interested in camping and hiking than in Fortnight and the like. Their parents push them into Scouting, hoping it will catch on, but it doesn't seem to. The other source of membership, Cub Scouts growing up to become Boy Scouts, hasn't panned out either, despite recruitment efforts.

We were a little misled when UUCG founded the troop. We were told that UUCG need only provide meeting and a little storage space. By providing initial skeletal leadership, we thought we were in excellent shape. We've since learned that most charter organizations also provide the initial boy membership and round out the many leaders needed with their parents. Today, UUCG simply doesn't have the membership profile to permit this.

We are encouraging our seven troop members not to leave Scouting, but to select and join another troop. They want to do that as a group. They will therefore be "troop shopping" together and we are shepherding that effort, with our knowledge of nearby troops that might be the best fit.

While we are sad, we are also proud to have introduced this group of boys to Boy Scouting and feel that we have, to some extent, introduced UUCG and our UU values to some members of our community we would not have otherwise reached.

A troop decommissioning event will be held on September 30 at 7:00 p.m. in the Sanctuary.

Webbing the Universe

This year's overarching theme for our shared ministry emerged from #37 in our hymnal "Singing the Living Tradition" second verse: "God who webs the universe with amazing mysteries, make glad my fragile soul so I can see life whole and bring hope to all on earth." This hymn speaks to bringing joy, hope, and peace to the earth. A lovely trilogy of values, synonymous in many with our mission: Curiosity. Courage. Compassion.


