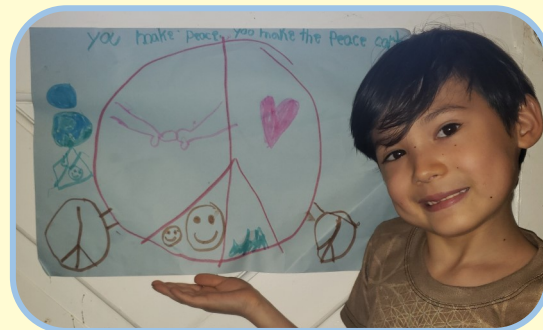

El Refugio provides critical support for detained asylum seekers and immigrants and their relatives. The organization is about a mile from the Stewart Detention Center, run for ICE by a private company, CoreCivic, in Lumpkin, GA. El Refugio's hospitality center provides free food and lodging for family members visiting their incarcerated loved ones. Through that learning, we can be more effective in extending our welcome and our service to all corners of Gwinnett County and beyond. I look forward to another year of building community, growing our souls, and being in service to others with you.

## Open Questions

As we move into fall, it's become apparent that COVID is not a quick inconvenience, but rather a long-term challenge. In order to work toward our vision, we must return to thinking about long-range plans and shift from a temporary mentality.

Your board held its annual retreat last month, joined this year by the five new Lay Ministers of the Shared Ministry Council. One important outcome of that retreat is the congregation's three "open questions" for the year. You will hear more about these in a future town hall meeting and be given the opportunity to participate in small group conversations to contribute your thoughts. This year's open questions are:

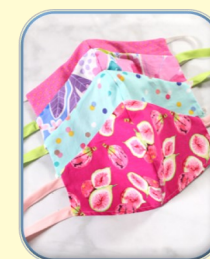


- *How do we navigate congregational life in the post-COVID world? What stays, what changes, and how? How do we determine our steps towards post-COVID gathering?*
- *How can we be better stewards of our finances, building and grounds in service to our vision?*
- *How can we share the story of Unitarian Universalism and our congregation with the larger community?*

## Generosity

I would like to take a minute to brag on you all. The congregation has shared its generosity in many ways this summer.



Nearly **2000 hand-sewn masks** have been made/distributed through UUCG to area hospitals, the Navajo Nation, a veterinary clinic, a personal care home, and individuals.

These masks helped prevent the spread of COVID at a time when supplies of PPE were short.

**1032 pounds of food** was donated to the Lawrenceville Food Bank by our congregation over the past three months. Donations have helped feed families at a time when many have lost their livelihoods.



Approximately **54 back packs** have been donated to the annual Corley Elementary backpack drive. As students return to the classroom this month, they will know that UUCG has "got their back."

Your contributions to the **Minister's Discretionary Fund** have enabled Rev. Jan to provide for the needs of UUCG members throughout this difficult time.

# UU the Vote

The National Conventions have ended, and the 2020 election is on the horizon. Ready to help ensure that democracy happens? UU the Vote is a national non-partisan initiative to increase voter turnout and assure that every vote is counted. As one part of that effort, the Unitarian Universalist Association has signed on with Reclaim Our Vote, which targets people of color in select states (Georgia among them) with a history of voter suppression.

Reclaim Our Vote is organizing a postcard campaign, and they need our help. UUCG will be ordering initial supplies for 500 postcards. Postcards come pre-printed, but personal handwritten notes of encouragement have been shown to be effective. We're asking that you take a pack of 30 (or more), add personalized notes (following a specific script), affix an address label (also provided), and post. Stamps for postcards are \$.33, so mailing a pack of 30 will cost about \$10.

We'll be holding a zoom postcard writing event in the second half of September, but you can do your part at any time. Please send an email to [president@uucg.org](mailto:president@uucg.org) in order to receive your pack of 30. Indicate in your email if you are able to take more. Include your mailing address, and you'll receive your supplies in early September.

September is a season of homecoming for us UU's, and renewal is central to that. At the opening of each new church year, we renew our commitments to each other and our church community.

We renew our energy for another year of journeying together.

It's also a time of renewing our renewal questions. Yes, that sounds odd, but it's essential to understanding the importance of this month, and the importance of our faith. You see, one of the less noticed roles of religion is its sneaky way of changing our lives by asking us to change the questions we ask. This is especially true when we talk about renewal.

In our culture and secular lives, the questions we ask about renewal focus mainly on health:

"Are you drinking enough water? Are you getting enough sleep?"; and work/life balance:

"Are you making enough time for family, play and rest?." Those are fine questions, but they don't take us very deep or push us very far. They don't enable the kind of transformation that religion wants for us.



And so along comes religion and it says, "Hey, look over here. There's a box with an entirely different set of renewal questions that nobody's opened yet." Questions like:

Are you sure it's your body that's tired, or could it be your soul?

Is it time to renew your responsibility to those who will come after you?

Is it time to renew your commitment to carry on the work of those who came before us?

What if you saw your daily living and loving as an opportunity (even a calling) to renew others' faith in humanity?

Could it be that continual self-improvement is not the path to renewal but instead compassionate acceptance of who you already are, warts and all?

What if renewing our common future isn't just about moving forward, but instead requires a return to an honest telling of the past?

And that's just the questions that are sitting on top of the pile!

So friends, this month let's dig in together. Let's remind ourselves that, indeed, we renew and change our lives by changing the questions we ask.

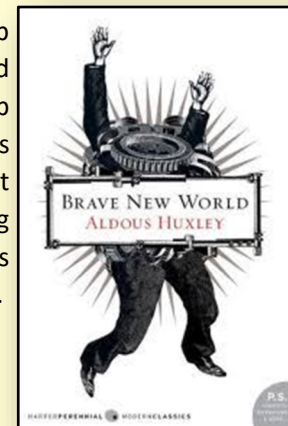
