Gadding About...

Our vision is to be a radically welcoming congregation, a sanctuary for all seekers who yearn for a faith community that will embrace them for all of who they are. Unitarian Universalist congregations embrace this wide circle of welcome for all who are seeking a liberal religious community.

The journey to radical welcome asks a great deal of us, and requires all of us to do the work! This program year, members and friends of UUCG are encouraged to be even more intentional in learning how to expand and deepen our welcome. We begin with the Transgender Inclusion in Congregations program. I took part in this program earlier this year and found it truly transformational. I encourage EVERYONE to take part! You will learn what you don't know you don't know about gender (turns out it's very complicated), the ways in which intersectionality of various identities compounds challenges for inclusion, and how we can shift the culture of our congregation to be truly, deeply, unconditionally, radically welcoming to all who are seeking our life-saving faith.

This level of inclusion is not unique to UUCG. It is codified in Article II, Section C-2.3 of the bylaws of the Unitarian Universalist Association (UUA):

Systems of power, privilege, and oppression have traditionally created barriers for persons and groups with particular identities, ages, abilities, and histories. We pledge to replace such barriers with ever-widening circles of solidarity and mutual respect. We strive to be an association of congregations that truly welcome all persons and commit to structuring congregational and associational life in ways that empower and enhance everyone's participation.

Our radical welcome also includes the wide range of ways people engage and express their spiritual and religious beliefs, also codified in Article II of the UUA bylaws:

Nothing herein shall be deemed to infringe upon the individual freedom of belief which is inherent in the Universalist and Unitarian heritages or to conflict with any statement of purpose, covenant, or bond of union used by any congregation unless such is used as a creedal test.

As a member congregation of the UUA, we agree to replace barriers of power, privilege and oppression with a wide circle of welcome, engagement and empowerment; and, we agree that there will be no creedal test to be a member of our congregation. Article II of the UUA bylaws is also where you can find our seven principles, the sources from which we draw, as well as the purpose of the UUA. It is an important section that defines our values and commitments as a faith organization.

For many years there have been proposals and discussions about making changes to Article II. At the annual UUA General Assembly in 2017, the congregational delegates authorized the formation of a new commission to review Article II and in 2020 the commission was formed and charged:

The Article II Study Commission is hereby charged to review Article II of the UUA Bylaws, and propose any revisions that will enable our UUA, our member congregations, and our covenanted communities to be a relevant and powerful force for spiritual and moral growth, healing, and justice. Proposed changes should articulate core UU theological values. The Board believes that one core theological value, shared widely among UUs, is love ... We therefore charge this commission to root its work in Love as a principal guide in its work; attending particularly to the ways that we (and our root traditions) have understood and articulated Love, and how we have acted out of Love. Article II Study Commission | UUA.org

I'll keep you all updated on the work of the Article II Commission as I expect they will seek input from member congregations.

Letter from the Board

Dear All;

Thank you so much to those who have pledged for the 2021 fiscal year. The board has approved a tentative budget for the coming year, and we'll hold a Town Hall Meeting after the service on Sunday, November 22, to share it with you and answer any questions you may have.

On our wish list are increases in spending on social justice and marketing/outreach, and in contributions to our capital reserve fund. We also plan to give hourly staff a 2% increase in pay and to increase Christiana's hours so that we can continue to offer online services, even in a post-pandemic world (yes, that day will come). Currently, we pay outside services for cleaning and lawn care. We are looking to take those funds and to add a new 6-hour facilities position. This person would handle routine maintenance and would move chairs on Fridays and Sundays to facilitate space sharing with Turning Sun School. All of this will be discussed on the 22nd, so come prepared with your questions and comments.

Our ultimate goal for 2021 would be to bring in pledges of \$160,000. Our tamer goal is bring in \$140,000. We have currently received pledges for \$117,900. If you've not submitted a pledge yet, please do so as soon as possible by visiting the website (UUCG.org) and clicking on "give" at the top right of the page. We realize this has been an unconventional year and that many are struggling financially, due to job loss or decreases from Covid. If you are unable to pledge this year, please let Reverend Jan or me know and waivers will be granted. For those who are not feeling the financial burden of Covid, please consider increasing your pledge in support of your fellow members who are unable to do so.

Just a note on this year's financial position. Due to our Payroll Protection Program grant from the Small Business Administration, we are doing well and have the funds we need and will likely end the year without having to use our reserves.

Thanks to all for your support of our island of sanity amidst a chaotic world. We look forward to seeing you at the Town Hall Meeting on November 22 following the service.
