





# Gadding About by Reverend Jan

Our May theme is Story in which we are invited to explore the question: What does it mean to be a people of story? This month we celebrate the 40th anniversary of the founding of the UU Congregation of Gwinnett, a story that is filled with many stories. Each person who took part in founding this congregation has a story of how they came to be part of this grand, and challenging, adventure. Since our founding, there have been countless stories of inspiration, transformation, tragedy, loss, discovery, friendships, heartbreaks, service to the wider community, and many stories that may never be told, or never fully told - or understood. Such it is with a community of faith - a community of seekers, wonderers, wanderers, and dreamers.

And so it is also with our individual stories, woven together to create the fabric of our lives. I admit that I am most intrigued by the ways in which our stories can change over time. Something that happened in our childhood may morph over time from something that was a great challenge or even traumatic to the story of something that inspired great action or service as we grew and matured.

Our stories are also interconnected with the stories of others in our lives ... and sometimes with people we've never met. Stories from our service to the wider community may touch lives we never know. Stories from our work lives may overlap with the stories of people served by that work. And, sometimes, our stories may include stories of harm caused to others, unintentionally or intentionally, and the hard learning that comes from such encounters. We have to have faith that we do more good than harm, and that the scale tips more and more to the good as we learn and grow in our understanding of how to be more fully human, and humane.

Sometimes we trap people in a story. I remember one of my brothers telling us (his siblings) that after he left home as a young adult, it seemed he was not allowed to "grow up" in the eyes of his siblings ... that we would always remember him for the not-so-great qualities he displayed as a young man that had mellowed and evolved as he aged. Some stories can keep us trapped in cycles of victimhood and self-loathing, or they can inspire us to establish healthy boundaries and discover all that there is to love about ourselves. What story are you creating? What story are you living into? What story would you like to be remembered by?

The story of our congregation is a never-ending-story (I hope!) and one that we are each and all writing together, every day. In the words of one of my favorite songs (Woyaya)

"We are going, Heaven knows where we are going, but we know within. And we will get there" ... together. Though the road is sometimes "muddy and rough" I believe ours is a story of becoming stronger, wiser, and more deeply engaged, connected, and making a difference in the world with each turn of the calendar.



# Circle 'Round for **UUA GENERAL ASSEMBLY**

#### Join us for Virtual General Assembly 2021!

General Assembly (GA) is the annual meeting of our Unitarian Universalist Association (UUA). Participants worship, witness, learn, connect, and make policy for the Association through democratic process. Anyone may attend.

General Assembly 2021 will be a fully virtual event due to the continuing pandemic and the uncertainty of vaccine distribution. This means anyone with Justice • Healing • Courage internet access can attend! We will gather on June 23-27, 2021.

*Circle 'Round for Justice • Healing • Courage* is the theme for General Assembly 2021. GA is a time to circle 'round in community. We circle 'round in care and healing; for liberation and justice; and for love and courage. We study ways to implement and live into our mission. UUA GA 2021 will incorporate recommendations from the Commission on Institution Change report, "Widening the Circle of Concern" and dialogue with the Article II Commission about our Principles and Purposes.

Registration is open for General Assembly and the registration fee is \$200 per person. Financial Aid is available, see the registration webpage for details. You do not need to be a delegate to attend. Only delegates can vote in general sessions. UUCG can send 3 delegates. Email Rev Jan at revtaddeo@uucg.org if interested in being a delegate.

### Serving as a Delegate:

Familiarize yourself with the business items on the GA Agenda. Discuss agenda items with your congregation. Learn how to effectively speak in General Session by reviewing the General Session Participation Guide. Learn about candidates for election. Delegate frequently asked questions.

## Give Away the Plate Nominations Needed

#### Who can nominate a charitable organization for GATP?

#### Who approves charities for GATP?

The Give Away the Plate Committee prioritizes nominations and approves recipients based on confirmation of eligibility requirements, selection criteria, and all available information. The team also seeks to ensure that a diverse range of charitable missions are supported by UUCG.

#### What are the requirements for an eligible entity?

- •The organization is recognized as a nonprofit charitable organization under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, and said status is verified. Individuals, trade associations and lobbying organizations are not eligible.
- •The organization's work aligns with the Unitarian Universalist Principles and Purposes.
- •A non-UU entity is eligible to be a GATP recipient 12 months after its last award.

#### **Desired characteristics of potential recipients:**

- •The organization has a history of significant achievements and shows signs of future success.
- •The organization has volunteer or engagement opportunities for UUCG members and friends.
- •The organization has local impact.
- •UUCG member(s) are or have been actively involved on a regular basis.

If you are inspired by or involved with an organization who serves our local area and whose work aligns with UU principles and purposes, please let us know! We are actively seeking worthy charitable organizations that can be truly impacted by the generosity of our members. Ideal candidates will also have the potential to actively involve UUCG members in their work. Nomination forms are located on the fundraising bulletin board in the hallway. # Current GATP Recipient — Path Project

Path Project operates community centers inside mobile home parks where children experience the love of Christ through education and positive relationships. At our community centers we offer programs that are designed using research-based best practices and are led by certified teachers and youth development specialists who serve alongside incredible volunteers. Through partnerships with park owners, schools, businesses, churches, parents and other non-profits we're able to offer on-site programs.

Jim and Melinda Hollandsworth started this program after learning from the school system what a terrible graduation rate the mobile home population in Gwinnett County had, in some places only 20%. Their



main goal is to offer mentoring and after school tutoring. They have provided every family in these mobile home parks with at least one laptop computer and a wifi system so that the students could do their on-line classes during the pandemic. They offer English classes for the adults who want to become more

proficient in it. They have created soccer leagues for the youth to participate in, and provide coaching and transportation to the games. Find out more at https://www.pathproject.org.

He has a certification in commercial air-conditioning, and currently works as a coordinator for a commercial duct cleaning company in Norcross.

He lives in Loganville with his wife and 4-year old son.

Michael's primary responsibilities include cleaning our building on weekends and moving the furniture to accommodate our programs on weekends, and the Turning Sun programs during the week. He is also responsible for the basic care of our

property: lawn maintenance, trimming bushes and trees, and generally assuring the property looks welcoming. You may see him assisting on property work days and assisting with congregational events. He'll be doing general maintenance in the building to ensure our lights are on, the water is running only when it should be, equipment inspections and maintenance happen on schedule, our road sign is updated, and our indoor and outdoor spaces are generally safe and welcoming.
